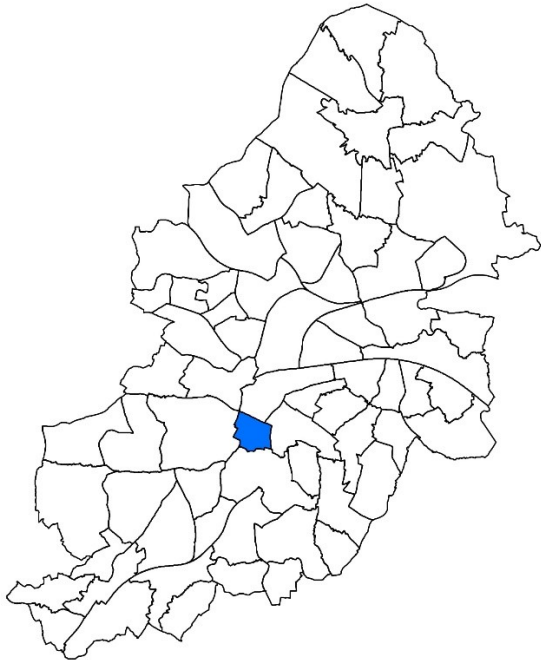


# Balsall Heath West Ward Factsheet



Balsall Heath West ward is located in the inner city to the south of the city centre. It has a population of 12,155 making it the 43<sup>rd</sup> most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Balsall Heath West is amongst the city's most deprived wards and has the 19<sup>th</sup> highest share of working age residents with no qualifications out of the city's 69 wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well below the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well above the Birmingham average.

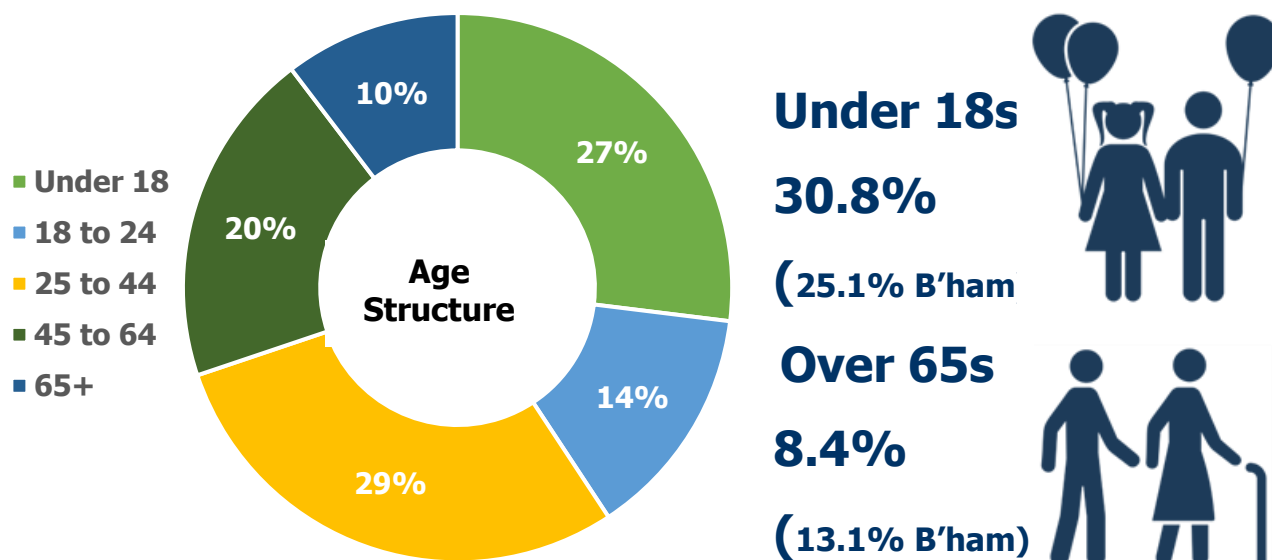

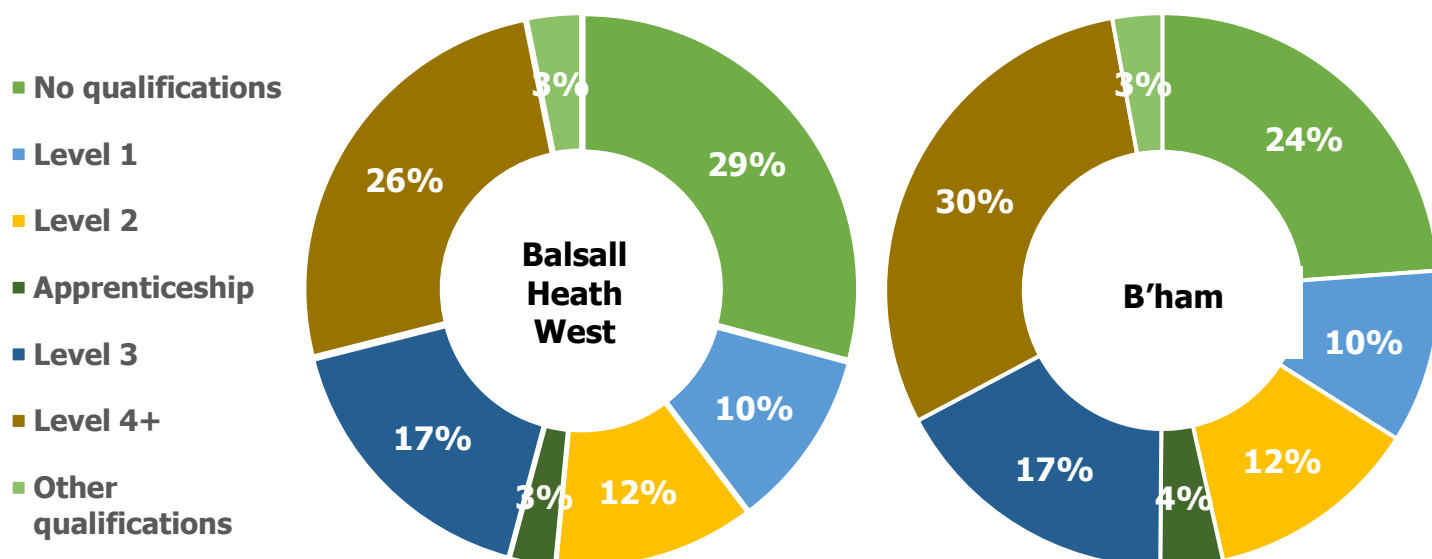

## Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 1,735 children living in low income households in Balsall Heath West, 46.7% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 17<sup>th</sup> in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

### Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Balsall Heath West stood at £77m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £6,558. Balsall Heath West has the 63<sup>rd</sup> largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
