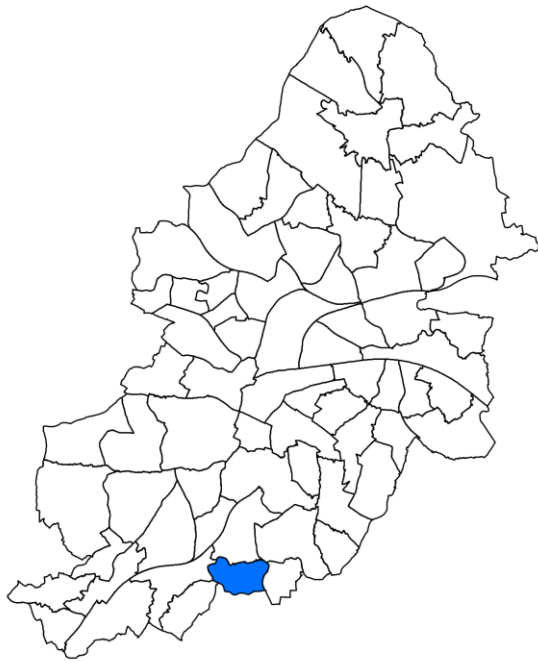


Druids Heath & Monyhull Ward Factsheet



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Druids Heath & Monyhull is an outer city ward located in the south of the city. It has a population of 11,645 making it the 49th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a similar age profile to the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Druids Heath & Monyhull is mid ranking amongst the city's 69 wards in terms of deprivation and has the 31st highest share of working age residents with no qualifications amongst the city's 69 wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are a little above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are above the Birmingham average.

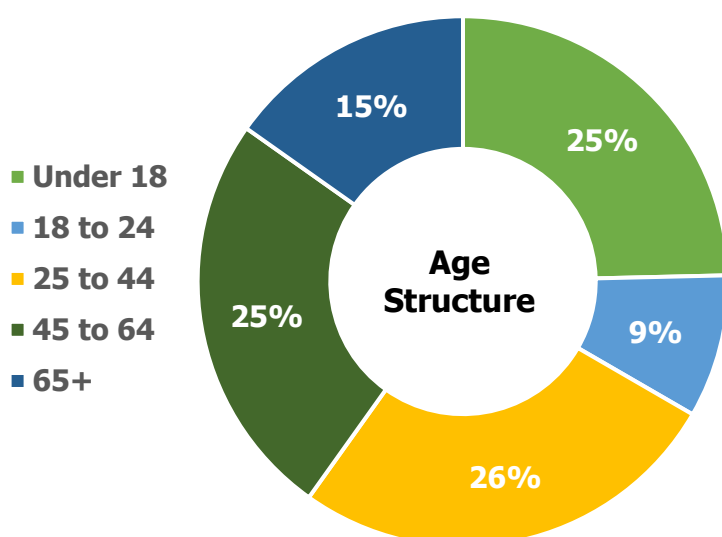

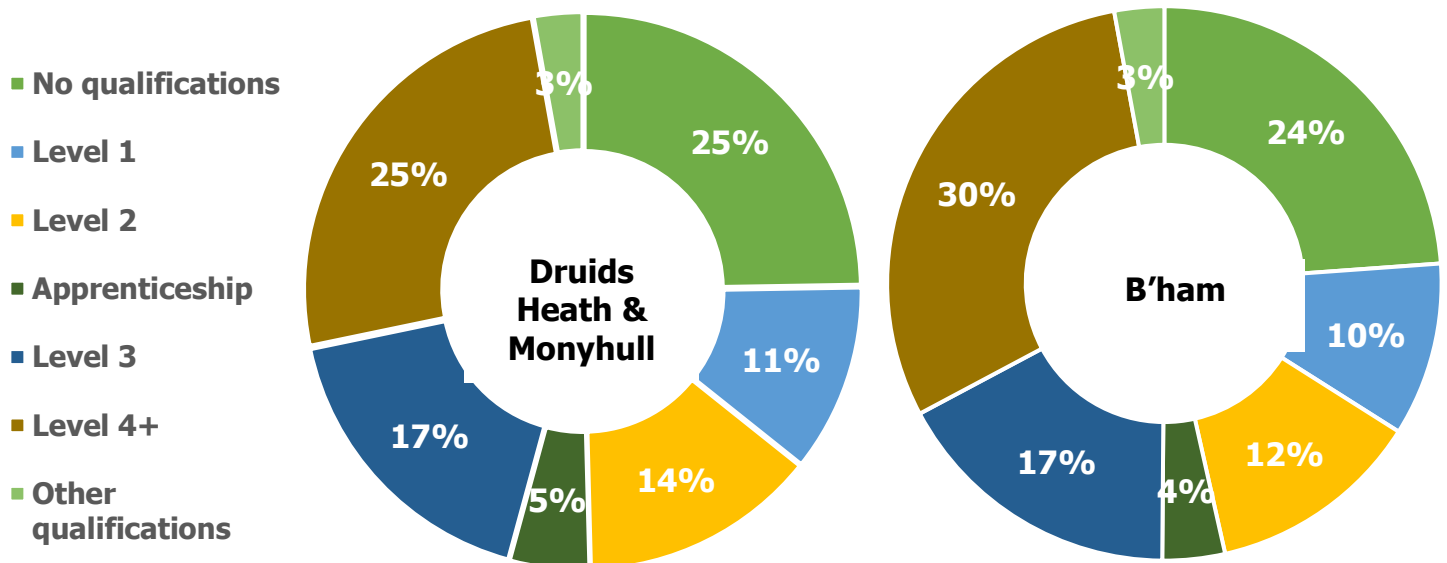

Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 993 children living in low income households in Druids Heath & Monyhull, 31.6% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 38th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Druids Heath & Monyhull stood at £56m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £4,832. Druids Heath & Monyhull has the 64th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
