

Heartlands Ward Factsheet



Heartlands is an inner city ward located in the east of the city. It has a population of 13,394 making it the 38th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a much younger age profile than the city as a whole and a higher BAME population share.

Heartlands is one of the most deprived wards in the city and has the highest proportion of children living in poverty out of the city's 69 wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well below the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are above the Birmingham average.

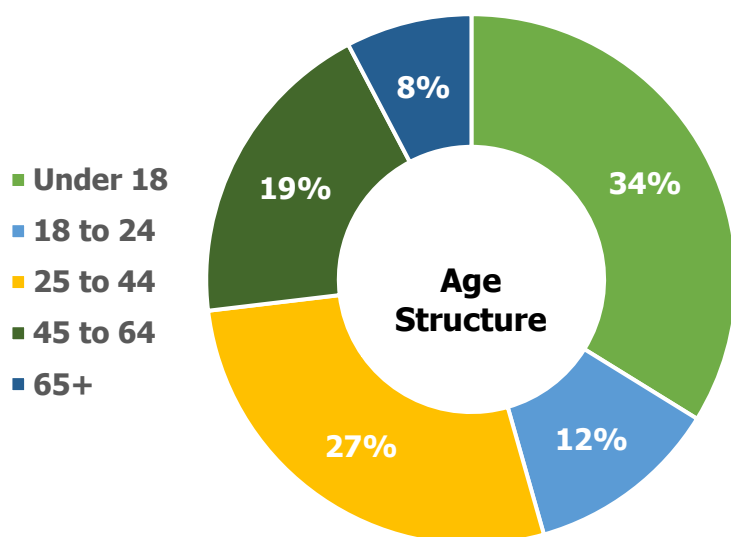

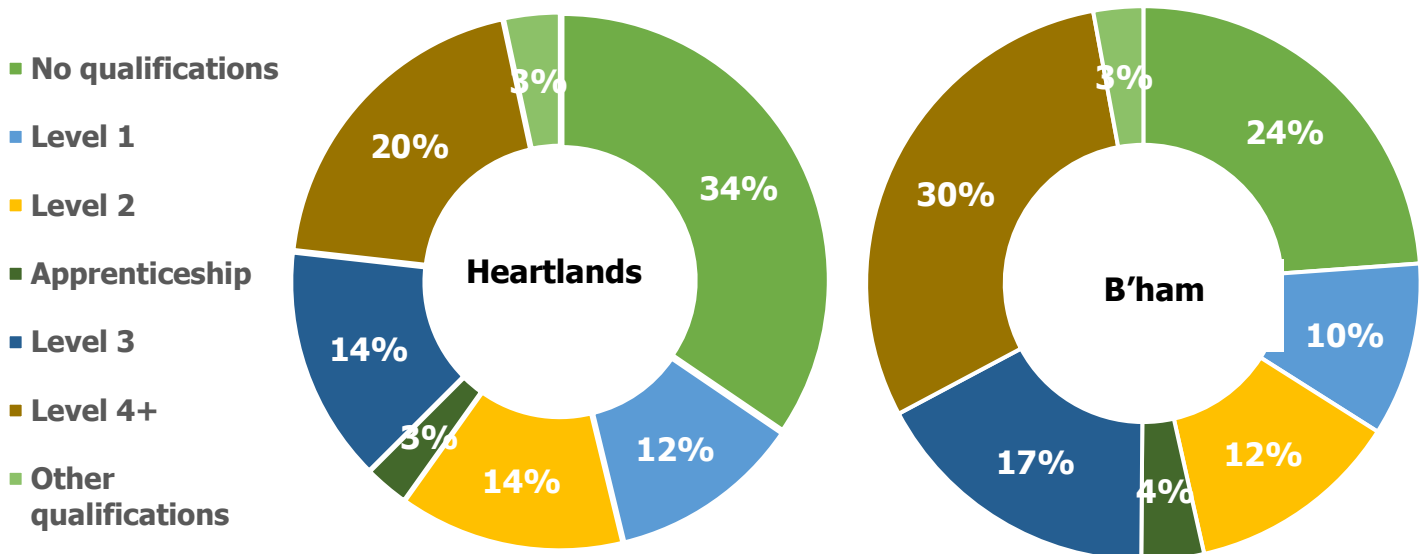

Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 3,254 children living in low income households in Heartlands, 64.7% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 1st in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Heartlands stood at £338m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £25,093. Heartlands has the 19th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
