

Kingstanding Ward Factsheet



Kingstanding is an outer city ward located in the north of the city. It has a population of 21,163 making it the 23rd most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a slightly older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Kingstanding is amongst the more deprived wards in the city and has a higher share of working age residents with no qualifications than the city average.

Resident employment rates in the ward are a little higher than the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are above the Birmingham average.

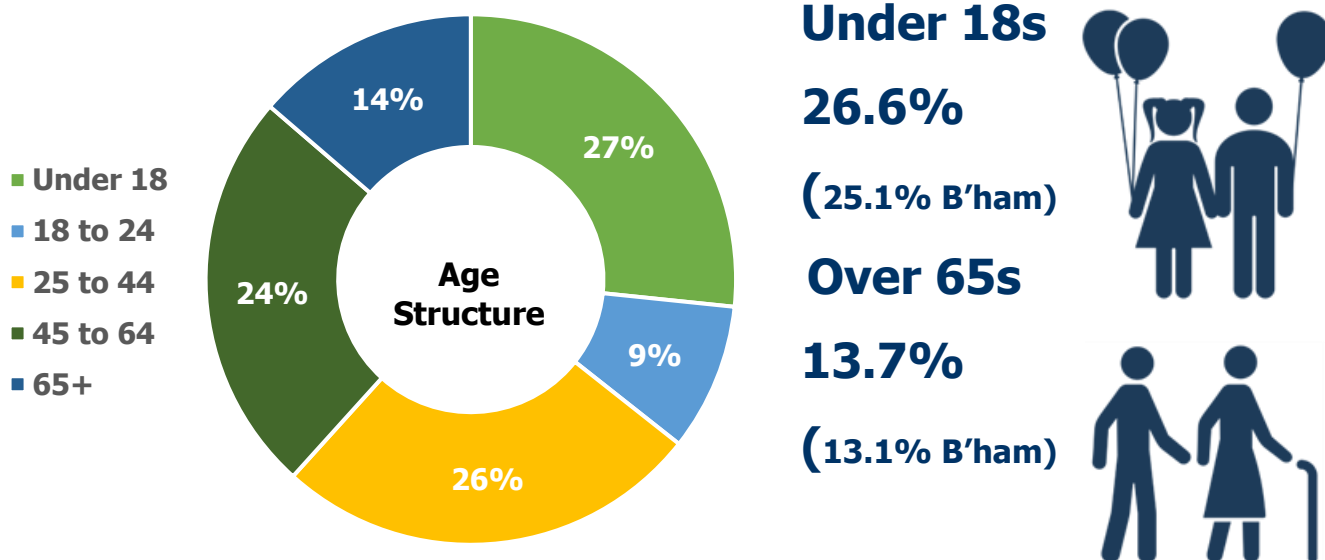

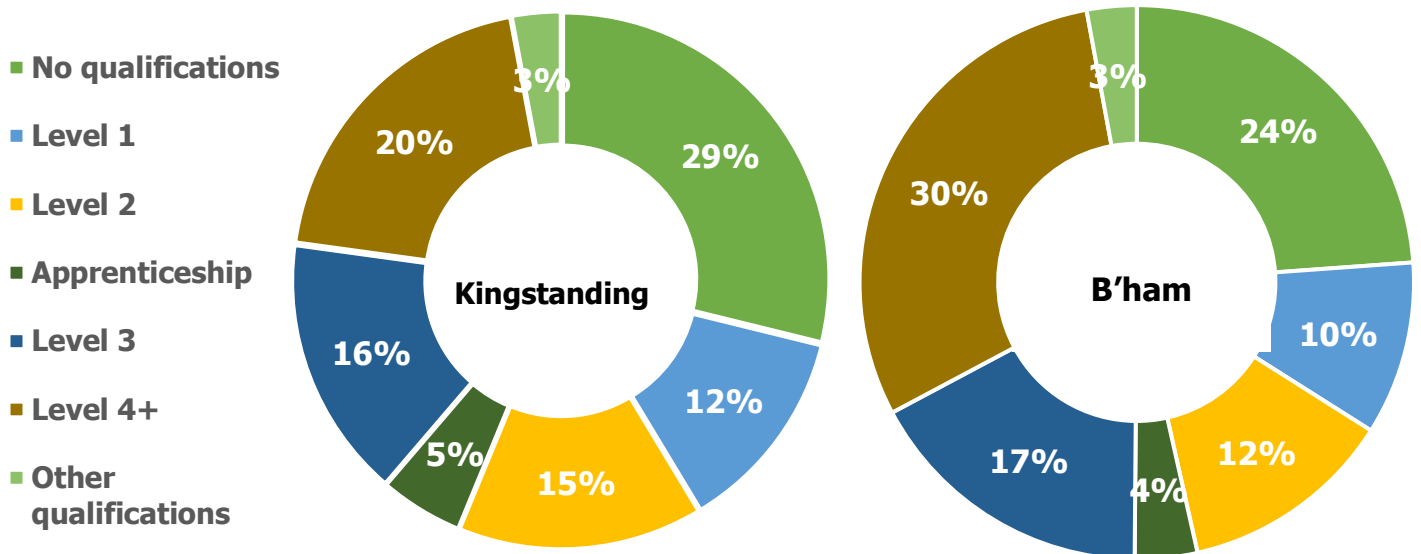

Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 2,105 children living in low income households in Kingstanding, 34.0% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 30th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Kingstanding stood at £127m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £6,069. Kingstanding has the 48th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
