

Soho & Jewellery Quarter Ward Factsheet



Soho & Jewellery Quarter ward is an inner city ward located to the west of the city centre. It has a population of 23,472 making it the 4th most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Soho & Jewellery Quarter is mid ranking amongst the 69 wards in the city in relation to deprivation.

Resident employment rates in the ward are similar to the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are above the Birmingham average.

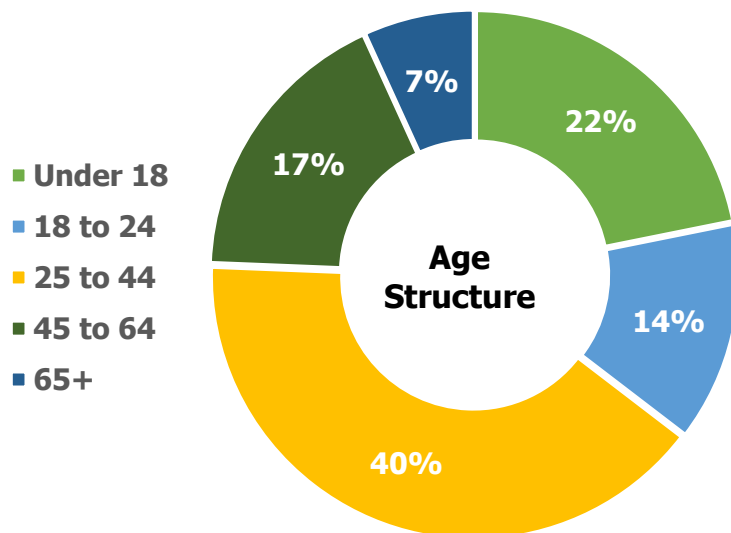

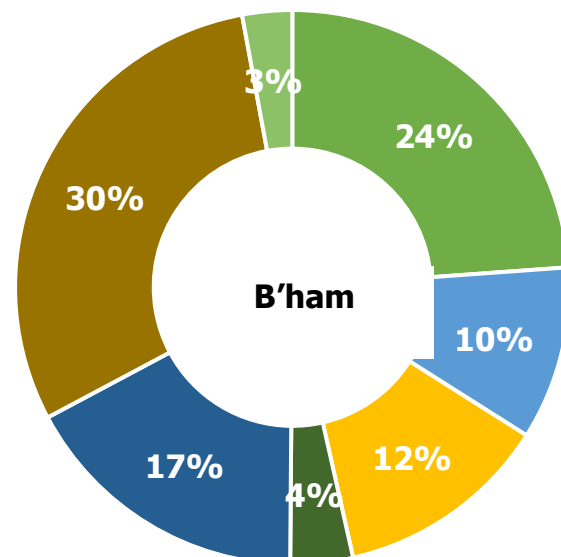
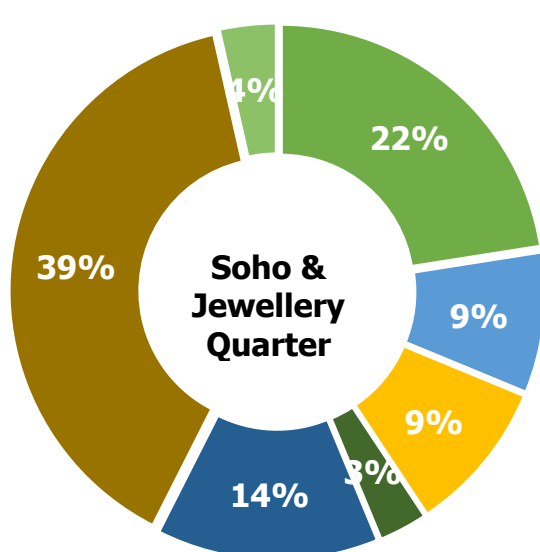

Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 2,909 children living in low income households in Soho & Jewellery Quarter, 47.4% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 15th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Soho & Jewellery Quarter stood at £1,559m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £56,871. Soho & Jewellery Quarter has the 3rd largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
