

Sparkbrook & Balsall Heath East Ward Factsheet



Sparkbrook & Balsall Heath East Ward is located in the inner city to the south east of the city centre. It has a population of 27,338 making it the 2nd most populous ward in the city.

The ward has a younger age profile than the city as a whole and has a higher BAME population share.

Sparkbrook & Balsall Heath East is the city's most deprived ward and has the 8th highest child poverty rate out of the city's 69 wards.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well below the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well above the Birmingham average.

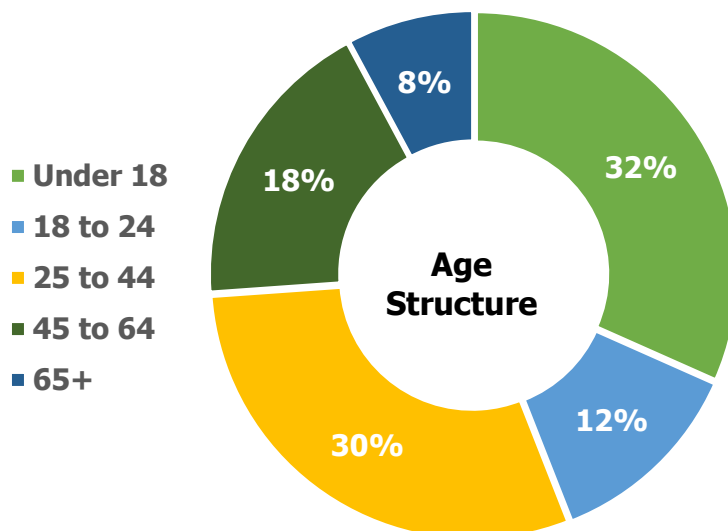

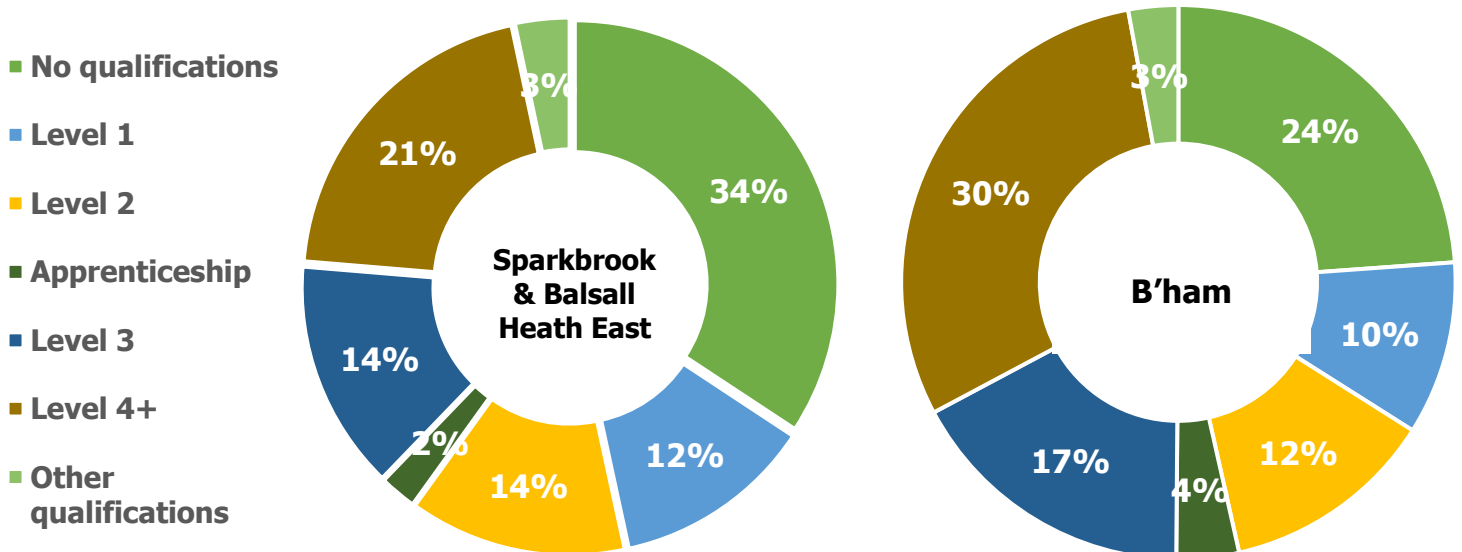

Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 5,617 children living in low income households in Sparkbrook & Balsall Heath East, 57.9% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 8th in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

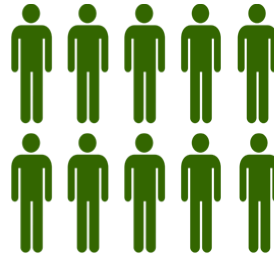

Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Sparkbrook & Balsall Heath East stood at £368m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £14,341. Sparkbrook & Balsall Heath East has the 17th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
