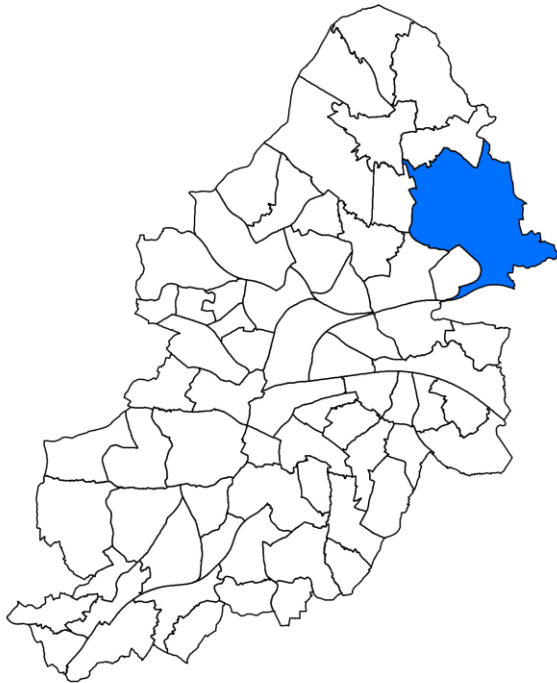


Sutton Walmley & Minworth Ward Factsheet



Sutton Walmley & Minworth is a suburban ward located in the north of the city. It has a population of 16,317 making it the 32nd most populous ward in the city.

The ward has an older age profile than the city as a whole and a lower BAME population share.

Sutton Walmley & Minworth is one of the least deprived wards in the city.

Resident employment rates in the ward are well above the city average and claimant count unemployment proportions are well below the Birmingham average.

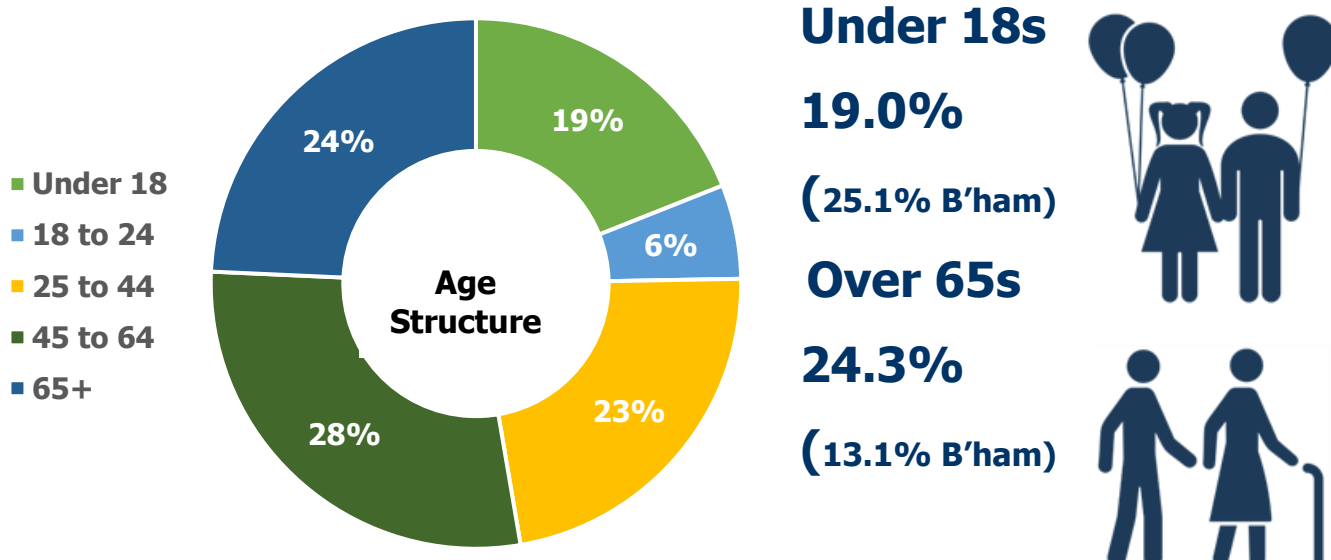

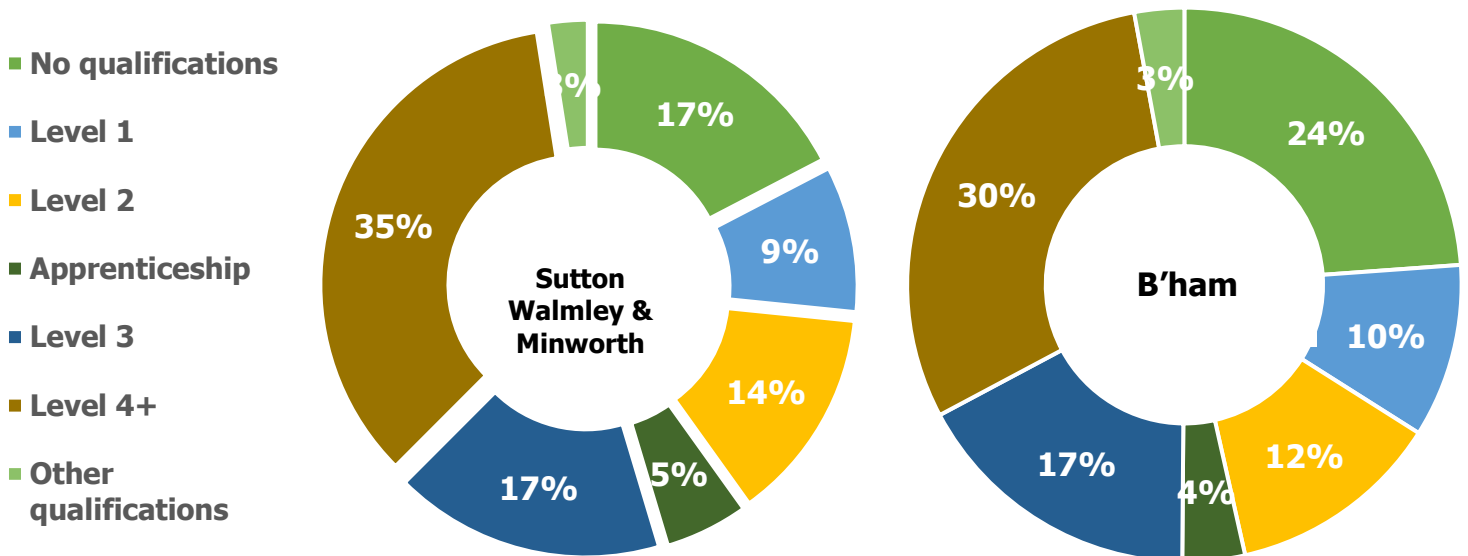

Child Poverty

Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) data on the number and proportion of children living in low income families provide an indication of the number of children living in poverty in each ward of the city. Low income families are defined as those whose household income is less than 60% of average household income. Only families who have claimed Child Benefit and at least one other household benefit are included in the statistics.

In 2021/22 there were 338 children living in low income households in Sutton Walmley & Minworth, 10.1% of all children in the ward, meaning the ward is ranked 63rd in the city in terms of the levels of child poverty.

Economic Output

New experimental data from the ONS provides Gross Value Added (GVA) a measure of economic output at LSOA level. Ward economic output has been calculated using an LSOA best fit approach. Total economic output in Sutton Walmley & Minworth stood at £473m in 2020 (latest data available) and GVA per head was £29,920. Sutton Walmley & Minworth has the 14th largest ward economy in the city in terms of GVA.
