The disposals of surplus properties in the Aston, Hall Green, Kings Heath & Moseley, Ladywood, Nechells, Sparkbrook, Springfield and Sutton Trinity wards will provide opportunities for individuals and groups to regenerate the area. The disposals will be through auction and or open market disposals. All members of the community will have an opportunity to purchase the assets available. The opportunities will be made available through markets press releases. No direct external consultation is necessary for the disposal sites. Therefore the community has not been disadvantaged or denied access.

3 Concluding Statement on Full Assessment

Full consultation and engagement has taken place with the Deputy Leader of the Council and the Cabinet Member for Development, Transport and Economy, the Deputy Chief Executive, the Director of The Deputy Chief Executive, the Director of Finance, the Director of Legal and Democratic Services and other relevant officers from the Economy, People and Place Directorates have been consulted in determining the principles behind which the disposals strategy has been developed. The relevant District Chairs and Ward Members for each property have been consulted.

Although there have been concerns raised by Cllr Brett O'Reilly and Cllr Jerry Evans, consultation is ongoing with a view to seeking to address these concerns, therefore no full Equality Assessment is necessary.

Any proceeds generated will contribute to BCC's financial responsibilities and strategic outcomes. The properties identified for disposal will not impact negatively on the community, therefore there is no need for a full assessment on equality grounds.
