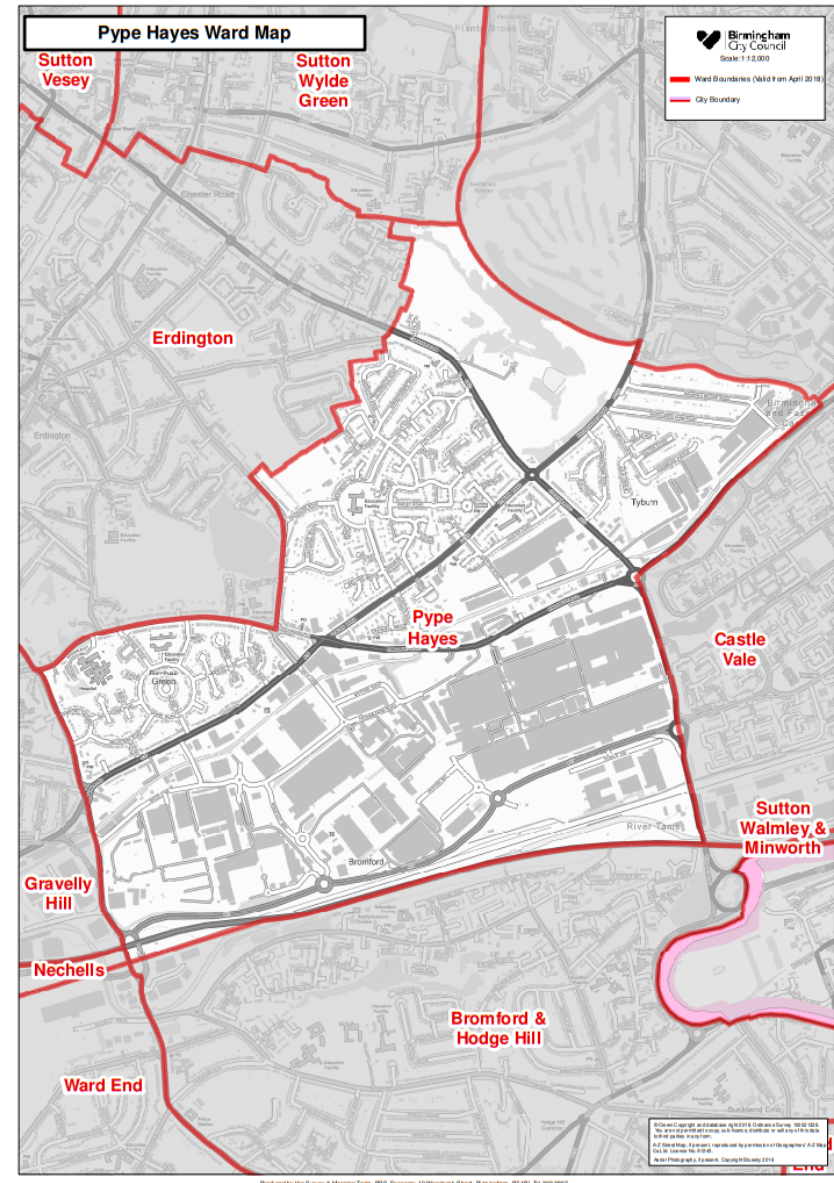

Priority 3:	Cleaner and Tidier Ward Local Parks and Open Spaces upgraded and improved Reduce littering and Fly tipping especially in hot spot areas Encourage groups and residents to work with friends of parks and community groups to take responsibility and help look after our open spaces. Remove graffiti
Why has this been chosen as a priority?	There has been increasing concern on fly tipping and litter across the ward. Residents want to reduce this and try and get it under control so residents can take pride in the local area they live in. Reports on poor conditions in the parks play areas and parks needing updating.
