Delivering Services for Our Children and Young People in Partnership

- <u>Birmingham Children's Trust</u> delivers early help, children's social care, including fostering and adoption services, in addition to leading Birmingham Youth Justice Service
- The Healthy Child Programme is delivered by <u>Birmingham Forward Steps</u> (NHS with Voluntary Sector Provider Collaborative).

Birmingham Children and Young People's Partnership

The <u>Birmingham Children and Young People's Partnership</u> is a collaboration between Birmingham City Council, Birmingham Children's Trust, Birmingham and Solihull Integrated Care Board, West Midlands Police and Crime Commissioner, West Midlands Police and the Birmingham Voluntary Services Council. The partnership works together as one, with a set of shared priorities that everyone is behind. The partnership is committed to working with families and communities, and improving outcomes for babies, children, and young people across Birmingham.

We want to make Birmingham a great place to grow up for our babies, children, and young people. That's why the Birmingham Children and Young People's Partnership have produced the <u>Change for children and Young People 2023-2028</u>, to that together we can change the conditions in which our babies, children and young people grow up.
