Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 75

- The path is first recorded on the deposited plans for the then proposed Birmingham and Leicester Railway 1845, where it is described in the Book of Reference in two parcels in Yardley parish, namely 32: "arable and public footpath", and 35: "pasture and footpath". [NB The Surveyor of Highways is only recorded as an owner in the case of roads in this document.] (The documents are held by the Warwickshire County Record Office at OS111/150/1-3.)
- The route is shown on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map of 1887.
- The southern end was diverted by a Quarter Sessions Highways Order of 1934, with a Certificate of Completion dated 14 June 1939. The Order specified the path as to be 7 feet wide. (Order held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library, Archives section at QS/B/21/1 (Boz 14, Bundle 1, item 11).)
- The section north from Audley Road was closed by a Quarter Sessions
 Highways Order of 1935, with a Certificate of Completion dated 5 July 1935.
 (Order held by the City Council at QS/B/21/2 (Box 15, item 40).)
- The remaining route is recorded on the (undated) City Council map of public rights of way.
- The path has staggered barriers at both ends, with old street lights, although the surface is in poor condition.
- It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
