Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 211

- 1 The path is shown, and labelled 'FP', on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1887) from Dads Lane to a lane which now includes Edwin Road.
- 2 The northern section, from the then proposed estate road (Cartland Road) to Dads Lane was closed by diversion onto new estate roads by a Quarter Sessions Highways Order with a Certificate dated 19 October 1925. (Order held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library, Archives section, at QS/B/21/1 (Box 14, Bundle 1, Item 9).)
- 3 The remaining path is paved, and lit, between Cartland Road and Newlands Road with chicane fences at both ends, and has bollards to prevent vehicle access on the section to Edwin Road.
- 4 The path is recorded on the (undated) City Council map of Public rights of way.
- 5 It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
