Dear Colleagues,

We are writing to ask for your support in protecting your students, families and staff against flu this winter.

Currently, fewer primary and secondary school students in Birmingham are vaccinated against flu compared to neighbouring local authorities and other large cities. This means more children in Birmingham are at risk of getting seriously ill or needing hospital care due to flu.

Following these steps will help protect your students, parents and staff from serious illness from flu this winter.

## **ACTIONS FOR HEADTEACHERS**

- Support on-site flu vaccination delivered by the School Aged Immunisation Service (SAIS) by:
  - o Ensuring all staff and parents are aware of upcoming flu vaccination sessions
  - Encouraging the prompt return of consent forms
- Distribute flu vaccination promotional materials to families
- Promote flu vaccination for eligible staff (those with underlying health conditions, those who are pregnant, those who are over 65)
- Share the resources with parents that are found by clicking on the links at the end of this letter
