

Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 247

- The path is first recorded on the first edition (1880's) of the Ordnance Survey 6 inch map., where it is labelled 'FP'.
- Part of the path is shown on the deposited plans for the then proposed Birmingham, Kidderminster and Stoke Railway 1889, where the Book of Reference describes parcel 42 in Northfield parish as "Field, Public Footpaths and stream". (These are held by the Warwickshire County Record Office at OS111/452.)
- Part of the path is also shown on the deposited plans for the then proposed Birmingham, Kidderminster and Stourport Railway 1892, the Book of Reference describing parcel 37 in Northfield as "Field and footpath", with the owners including the Northfield Highways Board.
- 4 Most of the path is shown on the Ordnance Survey 1/25,000 sheet SP08 (published 1952, with revisions 1870).
- When Senneleys Park Road was developed, a passageway was left for the path, as can be seen on the current Ordnance Survey 'Pathfinder' sheet 934.
- It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
