

Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 198

- The path is first recorded on the map with the Northfield Tithe Apportionment of 1840, which is held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library.
- Part of the route is shown on the deposited plans for the then proposed Birmingham and Halesowen Junction Railway 1871. The Book of Reference describes parcel 31 in Northfield parish as "arable field, marl pit and public footpath", the owners including the Surveyor of Highways. (The plans and Book of Reference are held by Warwickshire County Record Office at QS111/309.)
- Part of the path is also shown on the deposited plans for the then proposed Birmingham, Harborne and Kidderminster Railway 1888, the Book of Reference describing parcel 97 in Northfield as "pasture field and public footpath". (The plans and Book of Reference are held by Warwickshire County Record Office at OS111/447.)
- The whole route of the path is shown on the first edition (1880's) of the Ordnance Survey 6 inch map.
- The current Ordnance Survey 'Explorer' sheet 220 shows the north part of the path in the Woodgate Valley Country Park on a different route, with both ends lost under modern housing estates. No Diversion Order has been found.
- The route shown on the modern map has a good tarmac surface, with the original route being grass.
- 7 The path is not recorded on the (undated) City Council map of public rights of way.
- It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive map.
