Birmingham will be renowned as an enterprising, innovative and green city.



We know that we need to find a way of delivering services with less money


If the Government continues to cut public spending, by 2021 we will need to make further savings of



this is the equivalent of over 20% of our net budget for 2016/17






We have already reshaped what we do

Agile organisation


Operate as an agile organisation, through our workforce, commissioning, procurement and delivery models.
